### Items Back in Circulation

#### 1929 - 2021

The beloved illustrator and writer of children's books Eric Carle passed away on May 23, 2021 at the age of 91.

To commemorate his work, we wanted to highlight the many classic titles of his that are available in our collection:

<u>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</u> – Carle's most wellknown work, the story of a caterpillar that eats and grows his way into a butterfly.

<u>The Tiny Seed</u> – Another work about the cycles of life beautifully illustrated.

<u>The Mixed-Up Chameleon</u> – A colorful chameleon learns what it means to be yourself.

<u>The Grouchy Ladybug</u> – An ill-behaved ladybug shows children the importance of manners.

<u>Polar Bear, Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?</u> – The successor to *Brown Bear*. Comes in a kit with two plush polar bear toys and two copies of the book.

Also available as a kit: <u>Author: Eric Carle</u>, a collection of various titles that also includes the DVD Eric Carle, Picture Writer: The Art of the Picture Book.
